Our negative balance ROBO calls, texts and emails will be resuming on April 18, 2022. Although the Central Square School District is participating in a Federal Program called Seamless Summer Option (SSO) for the 2021-2022 school year and each student is entitled to one complete breakfast and one complete lunch at No Charge, all charges due prior to COVID will be reflected in these calls along with ala carte charges for this year. Please remember if a student brings a lunch from home and only gets a milk the account is charged \$0.65 for the milk as milk purchases alone are not included in the SSO Federal Program.
