Career Exploration Internship Program Spotlight

Were you aware that PVM HS offers an internship program? High school seniors have the opportunity to complete an internship in a chosen career field. This year we have around 15 seniors completing internships in fields such as teaching, dental, veterinary science, nursing, and more.

### **ASVAB Testing**

The Career Center offers ASVAB Testing to students and ANY student can take it. Since the information is not released to the military unless the student chooses to, the assessment can be used to provide career exploration regardless of gender, ethnicity, or ability level, allowing students to explore occupations in line with their interests and skills while developing effective strategies to realize their career goals. The assessment is being offered on Wednesday, January 15, 2025 in the Career Center at 8:30am and again at noon. ### **President's Volunteer Service Award**

Students who are interested in becoming eligible for the Presidential Service Award Recognition at graduation should stop into the Career Center to sign up. Students will need to volunteer during high school at an eligible nonprofit, community-based, and/or faith-based organization and follow the guidelines to provide proof of service. Those who volunteer for a minimum of 100 hours will earn the bronze level, the silver level is achieved after volunteering 175 hours or more, and the bronze is earned after volunteering 250 hours or more.
